PEOPLE OF ASHKENAZI JEWISH DESCENT ARE AT HIGHER RISK OF DEVELOPING PANCREATIC CANCER.¹

This is because people of Ashkenazi Jewish descent are more likely than other groups to have a BRCA1 or BRCA2 mutation, which increases a person's lifetime risk of developing pancreatic cancer and some other cancer types. Spreading awareness in this community is important, because it can help lead to earlier detection and better outcomes for people who will be diagnosed.

THE POWER OF HOPE AND COMMUNITY

Hope and community are at the center of taking control of your health, understanding risk and symptoms and even facing pancreatic cancer itself. There is hope for everyone diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. With the right team, right tests and right treatment, people with the disease can thrive. Community spaces like synagogues and weekly gatherings on Shabbat offer a powerful opportunity for starting a conversation about family medical history and the signs and symptoms of pancreatic cancer.
